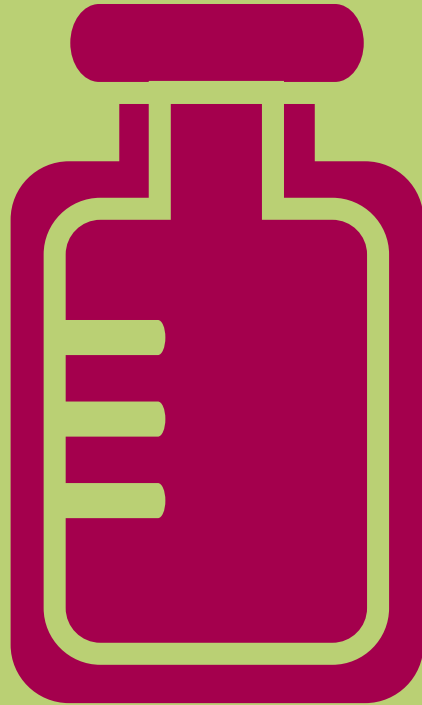


Hospitals can significantly reduce medication errors by scanning at the point of care.
